Lab 4 – Referencing Websites

Websites can be useful sources of information, but they can be biased or lack credibility. Find a website related to your topic. Evaluate the site and, if you find the site to be useful for your project, write a reference for it.

Argue whether this website is credible, or not credible, using the following criteria.

- URL
- Author
 - A scholar or expert? A regular person? An organization?
- Audience
 - Who is this information intended for?
- Bias
 - Is the site sponsored?
 - Is the information one-sided?
- Bibliography
 - Is there one on the site? Does it seem credible and complete?

Add the reference to your bibliography.

- Use APA format specific to websites.
